This special celebration includes an assembly, a remembrance gift, and the retelling of the story of Catherine McAuley and her legacy today.

AP Scholars

Forty-two students have earned the distinction of AP Scholar by the College Board in recognition of their exceptional achievement on the college-level Advanced Placement Program (AP) Exams. Students took the AP Exams in May 2009 after completing college-level courses at McAuley. Three students qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams. Seniors Earn National Merit Recognition

The 2010 National Merit Scholarship Program has recognized senior **Christine Jakes** as a Semifinalist, and seniors **Katherine Cronin** and **Anne Dailidonis** as Commended Students. The students took the qualifying PSAT test on National Testing Day in October 2008.

Christine now has the opportunity to continue in the competition for approximately 8,200 merit scholarship awards. To become a Finalist, a Semifinalist must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by the school principal, and earn SAT scores that confirm the students' earlier qualifying test performance.

The Commended Students are among 34,000 high school seniors nationwide who have been recognized for placing in the top five percent of the 1.5 million students who enter the competition. Katherine and Anne will receive a Letter of Commendation from Mother McAuley and the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

Quill and Scroll Induction

Eleven students were recently inducted into the Quill and Scroll International Honor Society for high school journalists. Inductees must be a junior or senior whose academic standing is in the upper third of their class; they must have served on a school publication for at least a year and shown superior work; and they must have demonstrated a willingness to offer service to their school. The inductees serve on the newspaper, yearbook or literary magazine staff. The guest speaker was Katie Strand, a 1997 graduate of McAuley.

Creative Communications

The English Department is happy to announce that sophomores **Mary Sullivan, Erin Carlson, Emily Drenovsky Ashley Rogers,** and senior **Taylor Piper** have had their poetry accepted for publication by *Creative Communications*. The works were selected to be included in the anthology entitled "A Celebration of Poets."

National Day of Writing

Mother McAuley participated in the National Day of Writing on Tuesday, October 20. There was an Open House in the Writing Center for faculty, staff and students, and each of the English teachers sponsored special writing activities to commemorate this day.

Mrs. Radvila's senior classes presented creative projects on the historical film "Anne of a Thousand Days," about the scandalous romance between the notorious Henry VIII and Anne Boleyn. This project served as an introduction to their upcoming study of Sir Thomas More in Robert Bolt's play, "A Man for All Seasons." **Mrs. Bewley's** students used the artwork in the Computer Center hall for creative writing prompts; **Ms. Mazzola's** class presented their creative writing pieces; and **Mrs. Murphy's** class used the Writer's Workbench software to practice skills of prose, revision, and more.

In addition, the staff of the Equinox Literary Magazine posted a special piece on the National Day of Writing website's Gallery of Writing (www.galleryofwriting.org).

Testing Program

The EPAS testing series (EXPLORE, PLAN and ACT tests) is utilized for educational planning and assessment. By examining the testing data supplied through the EPAS program, we are able to align our curriculum and implement instructional strategies that focus on developing our students' knowledge and skills. The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) is a standardized test that measures reading and writing skills as well as provides students the opportunity to enter the National Merit scholarship programs. Results from these tests will be given to students in December and January. Please contact your daughter's counselor with any questions you may have about the tests. The PLAN and PSAT tests were administered on October 14. The ACT is typically taken during the second semester of a student's junior year.

Students Pledge Against Violence in Schools

Sponsored by the Counseling Department, the Day of Concern observance included the pledge banner, pledge stickers and an all-school prayer to end violence. Grant Update

The 99th Street Summer Theatre Festival has received a grant from the Illinois Arts Council to support its 2010 program. The Festival is a favorite summertime activities here at Mother McAuley. Under the direction of Mrs. Haynes students, young adults, local performers and alumnae participate in the presentation of familiar and new plays.

School Improvement

The School Improvement Planning Team (SIPT) continues their work this year under the leadership of Mrs. Claudia Woodruff, Assistant Principal. The school improvement process is a five-year cycle based on standards established by AdvancED, a global school accreditation system. To earn accreditation, schools meet AdvancED standards, engage in continuous improvement, and demonstrate quality assurance through internal and external review. The standards are derived from research and based on factors that impact student achievement. Improvement of our students’ writing and reasoning skills are two of the significant goals of this cycle of school improvement work. The SIPT has expanded this year to thirty five members of the faculty and staff who meet on a weekly basis.

Tuition Payments

Tuition payments must be kept current. As of December 1, 2009, your account balance must be less than \$3,300 in order for second semester enrollment to be permitted. Please contact Terry Corcoran at 773-881-6507 if you have questions regarding tuition payments.

Education Expense Credit

Families with students attending private school may be eligible to receive an education expense credit on their individual income tax returns for the 2009 tax year. Specifically, qualified education expenses include the amount of tuition, book fees and lab fees. To obtain the bulletin, “Education Expense Credit for Individuals,” access the Illinois Department of Revenue’s website at www.revenue.state.il.us, call Illinois Tax Fax at 217-785-3400 or call the 24-hour Forms Order Line at 800-356-6302. Note: Statements will be prepared in January indicating calendar year 2009 payments. This information is needed to claim the State of Illinois Educational Expense Tax Credit.

Transportation Reimbursement

The Illinois State Board of Education issued a memorandum indicating that a fiscal year 2010 appropriation was not awarded for the Parent Guardian Transportation Reimbursement Program authorized under Section 29-5.2 of the Illinois School Code.

The lack of FY 2010 funding will prevent the State Board from paying any Parent Guardian Transportation claims filed for the 2008-2009 school year. These payments are normally made in December of each year. In the event that funds are restored this fiscal year, they will promptly pay the 2008-2009 claims that were submitted.
